This guide has been developed to meet the requirements of the Texas Education Code by providing those with custodial care of students in Plainview Independent School District with human sexuality instruction information.

Parents have the right to remove a student from any part of human sexuality instruction.

All curriculum materials used in human sexuality instruction are available for reasonable public inspection. Individual course content may/may not be taught on a yearly basis.

In all content areas, abstinence will be emphasized as the preferred choice for students.

Alternative life styles will not be discussed in the curriculum except in relation to sexually transmitted diseases. (HIV)

#### Middle School Human Sexuality Curriculum

Nurses and counselors assist students with questions or concerns as needed.

Separate programs for males and females on sexually transmitted diseases may be presented, and may include how they are contracted; symptoms, treatment and prevention will be discussed.

Health TEKS are to be taught at grades 6, 7/8 in PE and Pre Athletics/Athletics.

The abstinence program recommended by the School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) and approved by the Plainview ISD Board of Trustees is the program by Scott Phelps from Abstinence and Marriage Education Resources. (1-3 hours)

### Plainview Elementary Schools College Hill/Edgemere/Highland/Hillcrest/La Mesa/Thunderbird

#### 5<sup>th</sup> Grade

Separate programs for males and females that deal with the changes experienced during puberty are held on each elementary campus by the school nurse and a male teacher.

The school nurse/counselor will visit with students individually as needed about puberty/menstruation/personal hygiene/human anatomy/inappropriate touching.

#### PK-Grade 4

Currently, no formal human sexuality instruction is being provided in the elementary grades prekindergarten through grade 4. Nurses and counselors use teachable moments to provide informal instruction on topics of need to individual students.
