How Parents Can Help Their Students In Math

Talk About Math

Develop a conversation with your child around math

Ask questions about what they are learning at school

Have them explain what they learned today

Make It "Real"

 Relate math to everyday activities and create teachable moments (such as shopping, building, or cooking)

 Relate math to other real-life experiences (loans or debit account)

Talk To The Teacher

Get to know and ask for help from your child's teacher

Ask about resources (online textbooks)

Help With Homework

Encourage your child to find a homework buddy

Instead of giving answers, ask good questions

Be open to a variety of strategies to solve problems

 Have your student check out a calculator from the library

 Ask when your child can get tutored at school (before, during, and after) If you struggled in math, try not to pass your fears on to your child

 Try to provide a quiet, well-lit place for your child to study, away from TV, video games, telephone

Have a set bedtime routine so that your child is rested
