D'Lee teaches Pre-AP Biology and Environmental Science at PHS. She also teaches AP/ dual credit Biology with South Plains College.

On Saturday she will graduate with a Master of Arts degree in Educational Leadership from the University of Texas Permian Basin. She already holds a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Biology and a minor in Chemistry and a Master of Science Degree in Multidisciplinary Science, both earned at Wayland Baptist University.

D'Lee, a Floydada High School graduate, says she chose to be a teacher because she always loved science and hands on experiments. Her students seem to love them too.

She has been teaching for 16 years with the kind of passion and enthusiasm that is not only contagious, but creates a climate and culture where students learn, grow, and have fun in the process.

### Richard Roberts awarded technology grant

Plainview High School math teacher Richard Roberts is among ten educators nationwide to be awarded a Fall 2015 Classroom Improvement Technology Grant from eInstruction by Turning Technologies.

In announcing the grant, eInstruction stated that this year's grant competition attracted hundreds of educators from across the country.

"We had the privilege to read compelling stories of innovation with using technology with students," stated John Wilson, Director of the Turning Foundation. "Grant winners were selected based on how they planned to effectively incorporate technology within the classroom."

Roberts will receive a technology package worth \$3,600 that includes:

- ExamView Assessment Suite and Learning Series software
- Insight 360 Cloud to enable the delivery of content to mobile devices, student response clickers and interactive whiteboards.
- Mobi mobile interactive whiteboard
- 32-seat Classroom Response System

Roberts says the technology granted will make it possible to more closely monitor student achievement and adjust his teaching according to the gaps students have in their learning.

"I saw a demonstration of the Insight 360 system before applying for the grant,' said Roberts. "I truly believe it will help me address the needs within my classroom. I especially like that it

will allow me to monitor student progress while engaging students in the learning process."

He anticipates having the new technology will increase student motivation and participation.

"It seems today that if you put a piece of technology in the hands of a student, they automatically become more involved and interested in the learning," he said. I know that having real time data will allow me to adjust my teaching immediately to reach more students and close more gaps," he said.

He also says the technology will make it possible to more effectively monitor learning.

"In order to monitor students' progress and adjust my teaching accordingly, I need immediate feedback from students who are often unwilling to respond or ask for help."

That feedback will now come through the classroom response system and software supplied by the grant. The system places individual remotes in the hands of students that allow each student to key in responses to questions selected from the accompanying software or posed by the teacher. Although all students in the class can see a graph of responses, students maintain anonymity with only the teacher able to see which students may be struggling with the concept being taught,.

"The technology will assist me in finding gaps in student learning so that they can be addressed and corrected sooner rather than later," said Roberts. "It also enables the students to see correct and incorrect responses in a way



that allows those who make mistakes to remain anonymous and not to feel pressured in front of the class. Students will know immediately what they did wrong and learn from their mistakes as well as the mistakes of others."

Roberts, a tenth-year teacher at PHS, currently teaches College Prep math and Advanced Quantitative Reasoning (AQR).

"AQR is a class designed to expose high school seniors to practical applications of real world math," he said. "My diverse background and agriculture degree give me a different perspective on teaching and allows me to relate to students in different ways." Prior to coming to Plainview, he taught Vocational Agriculture in New Mexico for three years, worked on the family farm for seven years, and taught math for two years in Borger.

### Cameron Hurta advances to State UIL Debate Competition

PHS Senior Cameron Hurta will represent Plainview at the State UIL competition for the second time after winning first place in the 5A UIL Regional Congressional Debate contest held in Lubbock on Nov. 9.

Hurta was one of four students from PHS participating in the competition. Other members of the debate team are Avan Daughrity, junior; Alyssa Hurta, freshman; and Emily Herrington, freshman.

To prepare for the Congressional Debate contest, contestants draft legislation and research a docket of bills and resolutions dealing with social and political policies prior to the contest to create their speeches.

At the tournament, students caucus in committees, deliver

formal speeches on the merits and disadvantages of each piece of legislation, and vote to pass or defeat the measures they have examined.

Parliamentary procedure forms the structure for the dialogue with students responding to others' arguments over the course of a session.

Judges evaluate contestants for their research and analysis of issues, argumentation, skill in asking and answering questions, use of parliamentary procedure and clarity and fluency of speaking.

Each Congress session is approximately 3 hours with students speaking in 3 minute segments followed by questioning.

Michelle Pittman, communications teacher and debate team coach,



said that all four of the students competed well in the event which promotes leadership and communication skills through rigorous interaction and debate on issues confronting our democracy.

"Acquiring these skills help prepare students for learning and leadership throughout their lives," said Pittman.



Red Herring is my favorite word game. It comes in handy in the grocery store or TSA line. A game consists of 16 words. 12 of the words are placed in three categories of four words each.
